### The BW MPH Advantage

The BW MPH program was the first interdisciplinary program in Ohio jointly developed by an academic institution (BW) and an essential health system (The MetroHealth System) with the aim of reducing health disparities and advancing population health.





# What is Public Health?

#### **Public Health is Population Health**

Public health professionals focus on preventing disease and injury through:

- Designing & implementing education programs/interventions
- Developing policies
- Administering services
- Conducting research
- Regulating health systems

The fight against COVID-19 is a prime example of the importance of Public Health Professionals



### The Demand for MPH Professionals

According to The Department of Labor, the Public Health industry will see a 20% increase in employment opportunities within the next decade.

Variety of employment opportunities available within healthcare systems and the private sector (pharmacy, insurance, banking).

Possible career paths include:

- Social & Community Service Managers
- Statisticians
- Health Prevention Specialists
- Public Health Scientists
- Rehabilitation Counselors



## **Career Growth**

#### \$104,280

The median annual wage for US Medical and Health Services Managers was \$104,280 in May 2020. 32%

Employment of Medical and Health Services Managers is projected to grow 32% from 2019 to 2029, much faster than the average for all occupations.

#### \$81,130

The median annual wage for US Life Science Epidemiologists was \$81,130 in May 2020.

- Part-time / HyFlex program:

  - Only ~7 semesters at part-time pace
  - 42 Credits\*

## **MPH Concentrations\***

**Population Health Leadership and Management** 

- Develop critical leadership and management tools
- Work at leadership capacity in healthcare/NGO settings
- Two-years of prior work experience in Public Health or Healthcare sectors needed

#### **Health Education and Disease Prevention**

- Advance methods of community health assessment
- Develop/implement disease prevention strategies
- Prior work experience is not required

\* Two additional concentrations are in development for 2022 – **Epidemiology** and **Population Health Analytics**.

# **Admission Requirements & Tuition**

#### **Admission Requirements**


- Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university
- Preferred minimum GPA of 3.0 in all college/graduate work
- Resume
- Two recommendations
- Personal statement
- No GRE/GMAT required

#### **Tuition and Fees**

- Current tuition is \$823 per credit
- \$34,566 for the entire program (42 credits\*) over three years, part-time
- Employees of partner organizations receive a discount
- Comprehensive program costs include books, one meal per weekend when classes meet in person (two times per month) and parking.

\*Six additional credits may be required for candidates with less than five years of relevant work experience. Students can transfer up to six credits of eligible graduate coursework if completed in the last five years.
